Adult Carers Support Plan


As an adult carer you have the choice to complete an Adult Carer Support Plan.

The support plan gives you the opportunity to identify the following:

- Your thoughts and feelings about caring
- Your relationship with the cared for person
- Your social and leisure activities
- Your physical and mental health
- Your education and work life goals
- What would make things easier for you to carry out your caring role
- What would help in the future if you were no longer able to care.

We received £1000 from the Cash for Kids Summer grant and thanks to this our young carers had a fun packed summer.

We had a week full of activities in July starting with a pool tournament in the centre, then we were off to Intime Escape Rooms in Ayr with two groups. The first group raced against the clock in the Abandoned Academy to find out what happened to the missing teacher and pupils, with just 4 minutes and 39 seconds over the hour, the young carers worked together to figure out the puzzles and escape the head master. Our second group were transported to the festive season and with the timer ticking the team had to fix the elves mistake to save Christmas as buddy had forgotten to make Rudolph's magic reindeer food, we are happy to report that the group saved Christmas in just 47minutes and 48 seconds. Well done to all young carers who attended. Our next trip saw 8 primary aged young carers enjoy a trip to Ayr Equestrian Centre for a relaxing afternoon of horse riding including a group lesson followed by a forest trail. This was a great afternoon and Emma and Tonya are very proud of the young carers for stepping outside their comfort zone, we would also like to thank the staff, volunteers and of course the horses: Esme, Lili, Oreo and Danny for their kindness and patience with the young carers. Next, we were off to LA Bowl, where two groups enjoyed games of bowling and had fun playing arcade games. We finished the week with two movie sessions in the centre, our primary group enjoyed popcorn and sweets while watching 'Bigfoot's Family' while our secondary aged group had lots of fun watching 'Grown Ups'.

Our Summer programme continued in August with a trip to the low green in Ayr, where young carers spent the afternoon having lunch while painting some dragons, elephants and monkeys for Pick me up Paints in Ayr. We were also able to provide art packs for young carers to take home who could not attend this event. On our last event for the summer programme we spent a cosy rainy afternoon in the centre playing board games and making milkshakes, with biscoff being a fan favourite. This was a summer packed with fun, laughter and great memories made.

Rage Room and Axe Hurling

Our young adult carers enjoyed a trip up to Glasgow for a day of axe throwing and rage room. We started with the rage room where the young adults had a blast smashing up and destroying items from a tv and computer to glass-ware, phones, plates and much more. Once we had finished in the Rage Room we moved on to Axe Hurling, where the young adults and the young carers team tried to hit as many bullseyes as possible. This was a fantastic day enjoyed by all, and let our young adult carers release a lot of stress.





Young Carers Festival

Young Carers enjoyed a three-day trip to the 2022 Scottish Young Carers Festival this month. This provided young carers in South Ayrshire, and nationally, a break from their caring roles and time to spend with other young carers enjoying a variety of activities and experiences including workshops, discos, camping, zip lines, water slides, fire and magic shows, inflatables and much more!

This also supported young carers voice as our group had the opportunity to find out what is happening across Scotland for young carers, advocate for young carers, provide feedback, share their views and ask questions through consultation zones, media ambassadorships and political speeches.

Young Carers Statement

A Young Carers Statement (YCS) can be completed for any young person under 18 years old or over 18 but still at school.

The young carers statement is completed by having a conversation with health, education, social work or someone you feel comfortable talking to in order to establish if it is appropriate for you to care for someone else.

The young carers statement will identify your individual outcomes and what matters to you as a person such as:

- Details about the person you care for and support you provide;
- The impact caring has on your health and wellbeing;
- The extent that you are able and willing to provide care;
- The nature and extent of the care provided is appropriate;
- Any support which is needed, either for you or the person you care for;

You can ask the following for a young carers statement:

- The Care Manager of the person you care for or contact their local Health and Social Care Office directly
- The South Ayrshires Carers Centre to request a YC Statement.

Young Carers Grant

The Young Carer Grant is a lump sum of £326.65 that is given to young carers aged between 16-18. To be eligible for the grant you need to be caring for someone for 16 or more hours a week and the person you care for must receive one of the qualifying benefits, and you cannot be claiming Carer's Allowance.

If you want more information on the grant or think that you might be able to apply for the grant, speak to Emma or Tonya and they can help you to apply.

Young Scot - Young Carers Package.

The Young Carers Package is a special bundle of treats available to all young carers, aged 11 to 18 inclusive in Scotland. It's filled with special treats to help Young Carers make the most of their free time and support them in their caring role. Best of all, it's completely free!
